Course Description:

Symphonic Band is for wind instrument players in grades 9 through 12. This ensemble teaches music through performance in an ensemble setting. Each student will study various wind literature pieces and the technical, historic, and musical elements of each piece. The object of this course is to increase the student's overall musicianship and improvement on his/her instrument. This ensemble performs a winter concert, music in our schools concert and spring concert which are mandatory performances.

Required Method Book:

Required Article Readings/Listenings:

Required Materials:

Instrument Reeds / Valve Oil / Slide or Cork Grease / Neck Strap Metronome/Tuner Pencil

Course Learning Outcomes:

- 1. Students will be able to locate and identify the pitch names on the treble clef & bass clef staff
- 2. Students will be able to perform basic rhythms using whole, half, dotted half, quarter, dotted quarter, eighth notes triplets and sixteenth notes.
- 3. Students will be able to define music theory terms and apply them in their description of music
- 4. Students will be able to sing in tune using solfege syllables to a variety of exercises
- 5. Students will be able to perform simple melodies and songs on their instrument by ear
- 6. Students will be able to comprehend, apply and analysis basic elements of music theory
- 7. Students will be able to perform all 12 major keys and minor keys
- 8. Students will be able to perform two to four concerts each year
- 9. Students will perform in a PMEA Music Performance Assessment (State Festival)

Objectives of the Band Program:

- To provide a musically engaging experience for all band members
- To develop and improve the performance skills of the various wind and percussion instruments
- To provide for the musical needs of the school and the community
- To foster life skills which will contribute to the students overall education in preparation for post secondary careers including leadership, critical thinking, communication skills, and cultural and historical knowledge
- To promote a means of creative expression through musical performance

Tardy Policy:

Any student who is not in their seat with their instrument and music **3 minutes** after the bell rings will be marked tardy for the day.

1st offense	= tardy
2nd offense	= 0 on rehearsal points for that day
3rd offense	= discipline referral (deduction of rehearsal points grade)

Each tardy given counts for that nine s only. Every student begins each nine s with a clean slate.
